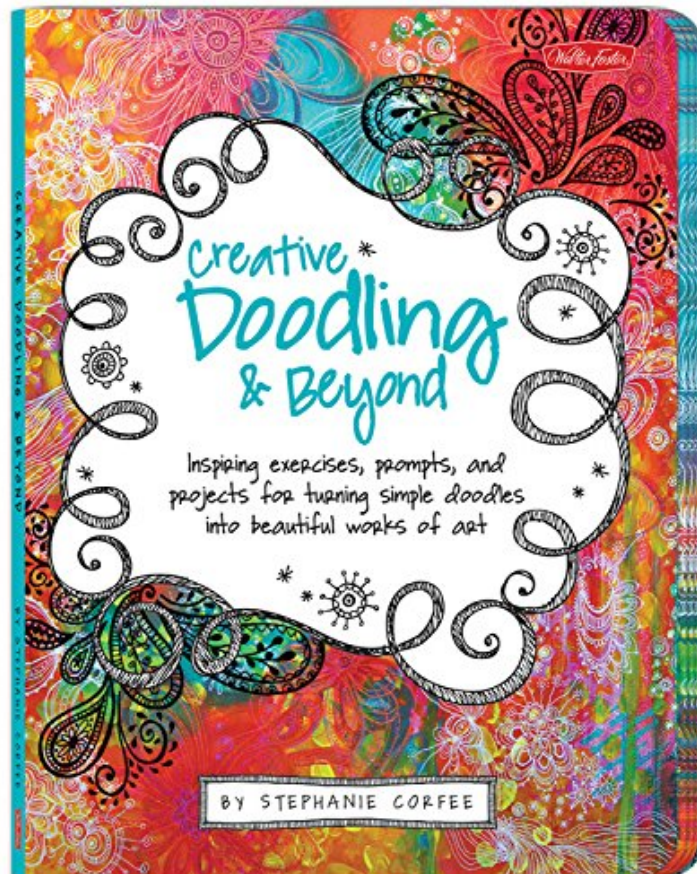

material. There is a lot more here than in the thin little zentangle books. (The zentangle books are good, just a little thin for the price.) It is a really beautiful book. It is fun to look through. I like having the blank practice space in the book. I enjoy going through the book practicing all the doodles, it is very relaxing. I find myself more likely to practice as opposed to other books I have where I have to get out a separate piece of paper to doodle with. Once I have practiced the doodles, I find myself incorporating many of the elements into my own doodles. Since using the book, I find myself doing many new designs in doodling and not just things in the book. It is like the doodles in the book are sparking off new doodle ideas in my head. I enjoy the author's style of doodling. It is very loose and casual and freeform. It feels more spontaneous than the zentangles style of doodling. With a few exceptions, such as the portrait doodles, I did not feel that I needed to work on my artistic skills before I could do them. I did not care for the projects. Most of them seemed to be geared toward a parent with young children. I was a bit puzzled that the purse project called for doodling on paper, scanning your doodle, printing it out on an iron on sheet, ironing it on the project and then coloring in with fabric markers. It seemed needlessly complex. Why not just doodle directly on the project with fabric markers? I was disappointed that doodling on abstract painting was only presented as an idea and not done out in detail. This is the techniques used to create the amazing cover of the book. I would like to try it, but I do not have enough information. Will any type of pen work over any type of paint? Do you put a fixative on it in between the paint and the pen? I suppose I could experiment, but canvas is significantly more than paper. I do not want to waste a bunch of canvas finding the right combination. Even though I did not care for the projects, I felt there is still enough in the book I liked to make me happy with my purchase. 14 of 14 people found the following review helpful. My Grandkids Use It By Karen K. Little I gave this book to my grandkids (5, 6, and 7) to introduce them to drawing concepts and I'm pleased to say that they are interacting with the book! Mission accomplished I have doodled since discovering crayons, but did not understand "doodling's" value or how it applied to the type of art I love best - pen ink. Well, in 2012, I happened upon Zendoodle and doodle-related books and realized visually the theory (techniques?) that support the art of line-art illustration. I also now understand how Indian, Moorish, and other intricate, seemingly impossible designs were constructed. I even "got" what Frank Lloyd Wright did when designing stained glass windows! While this book does not provide a heady discussion about stroke, it provides examples and exercises that can be intuitively "soaked in." Note that Zendoodle- and doodle-related books have changed my life in terms of understanding drawing and design, as well as significantly elevated the quality of my own work. By Customer Creative Doodling Beyond by Stephanie Corfee is a beautiful book meant to be user friendly in that one can doodle right in the book itself. Perhaps not the best choice for libraries to circulate given this feature, but it is a wonderful addition to a personal library. For those running art programs, the book is chock full of ideas that can inspire even the most reticent artist to creativity. The book presents well as a colorful oversized paperback with rounded corners and gorgeous designs on the cover. This is not a book for an unskilled artist, however. The designs are presented as a whole, not in a step-by-step fashion that can be quite intimidating for the aspiring doodler. Unlike some other books in a similar vein like Zentangle Basics by Suzanne McNeil or Yoga for Your Brain by Sandy Steen Bartholomew, this book presumes the artist already has their doodling skills established. The creativity projects within the book are a great next step for those who have worked their way through other tangle books and are ready for a "what next" activity. Some of the projects in the book including making your own doodle stamp and using it to create wrapping paper, designing unique gift tags and making family heirloom handprints are some great ideas for people looking for a next step. Being an avid doodler myself and having worked my way through every Zentangle book in print, this book was a pleasant surprise. However, had it been the first book I purchased, I would have been a bit intimidated. The author comes at the book from more of a purist art perspective with lots of talk about line weights, symmetry and balancing forms that may go over the head of someone just interested in new ideas for using their doodling skills. In addition, only completed designs are shown - beautiful but perhaps difficult to tease apart for the novice doodler. VERDICT: A colorful and inspiring book for further use with your doodling projects. Perhaps not the best choice for a circulating collection of a library but a great addition to a personal library of any artist, aspiring or professional interested in this artform.[...]
