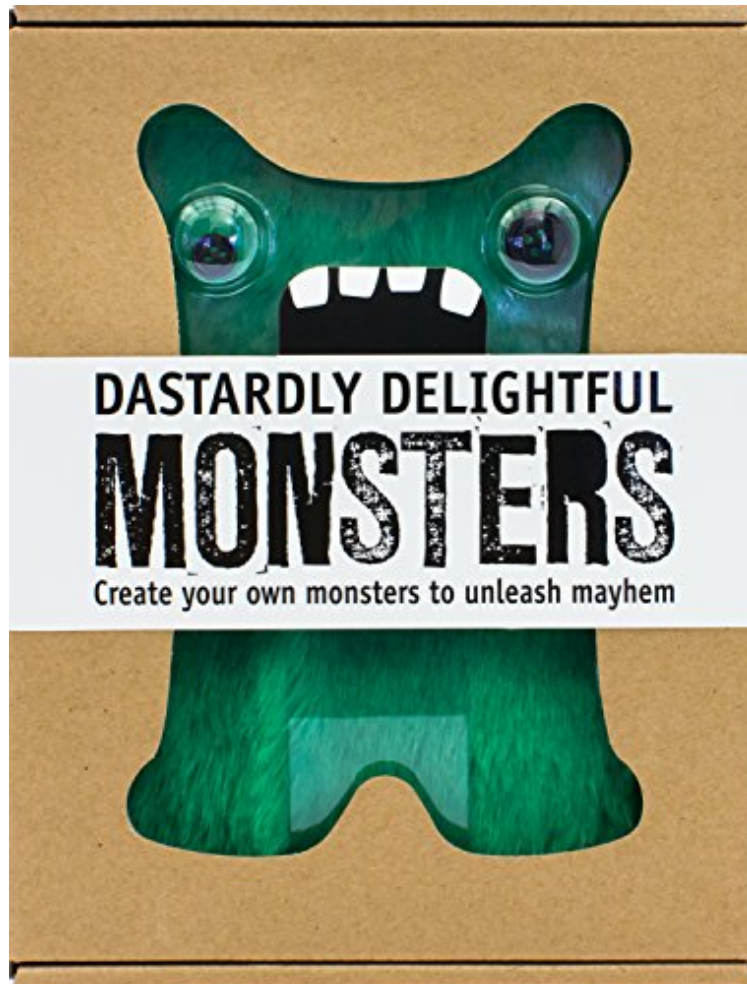

Hensel This was received as a gift for my 3 year old who loves monsters/dinosaurs. I'm pretty disappointed with this and here's why... (First let me preface by saying I'm a crafty person and enjoy making things, so while I didn't mind making the monster it's just not what I was expecting once I got started) 1) Only enough material to make one monster, and you

must be very careful with what you're given (they give you juuuuust enough felt to cut the pieces needed).2) Not all materials are supplied. For the one "Sock Monster" you are able to make, it tells you to use white floss for most of the sewing, but you're only given green.3) All sewing, no gluing. Now this can be seen as a positive, I suppose, except that this means my 3 year old can't really participate in making the monster at all. I also feel there is a fine line between the skill level needed to sew this monster and a child being young enough to actually want to make it. My 10 year old would need assistance too.4) The templates at the back of the book are crammed onto one page, with each template piece overlapping others. This means you need to photocopy the page multiple times to be able to cut out each piece. While the monsters in this book are really cute, I wish they'd supply more materials and make it more kid friendly. My child will love this when it's finished (I'm almost done. It probably took me 2 hours total), but I really wasn't expecting that I would have to make the whole thing AND by hand-sewing it!3 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
