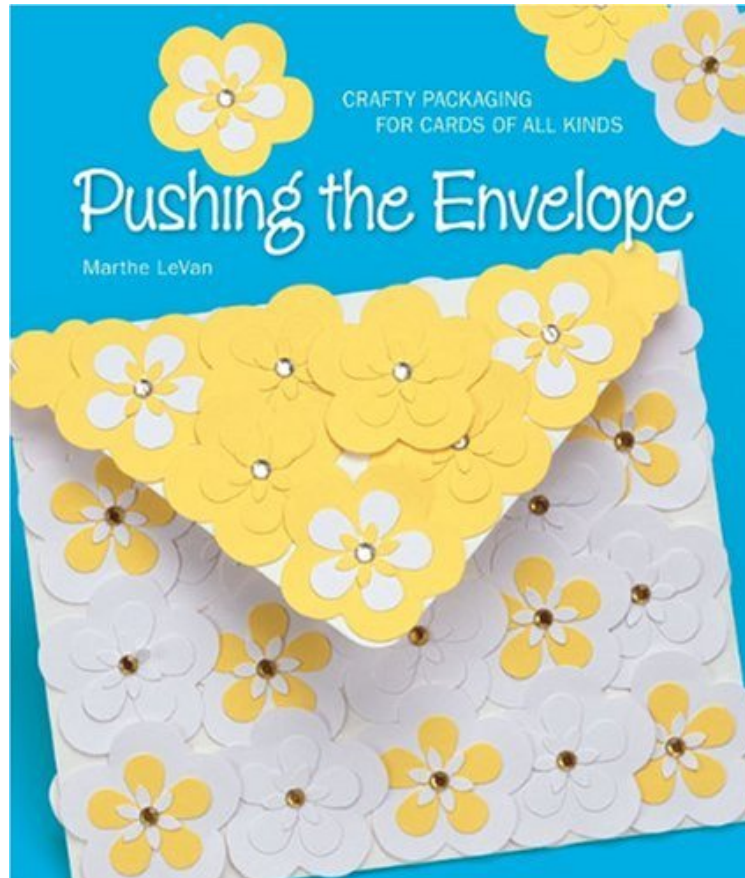

Some involve embellishing commercial envelopes with surface treatments, such as stamping. Others require folding techniques, and a few use unconventional and recycled materials. There are projects for packaging CDs, photographs, gift cards, and more.

From Booklist There are plenty of books on making greeting cards, but few pay attention to the envelope that holds the message. That makes this unique. Although most of the designs are too decorative to actually mail, they make delightful packaging for a host of special-occasion notes. Following information on stocking a crafter's toolbox and guidelines for envelope folding come instructions for 36 projects contributed by 20 different designers. Quick, mostly easy, and very clever, the ideas make the most of plain old paper but also venture beyond the expected to incorporate lace, buttons, fabric, old books, maps, and lots more to give envelopes a whole new look.
