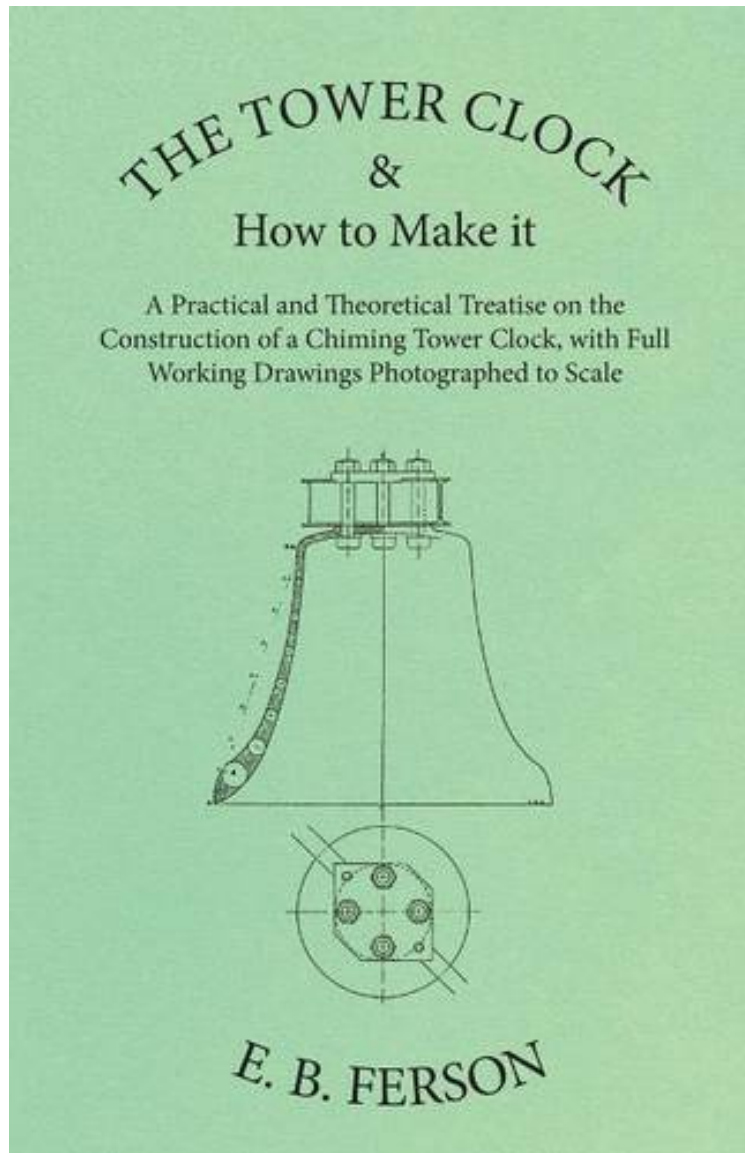

Unfortunately, nearly every drawing is completely washed out and unrecognizable. It's maddening. Of the two pictures I'm uploading, one is a picture from page 14 in the book. The other is a screen shot of the scanned in version I found on the net for free. Just search for the book title and it will come up. Tower clockBy Alan HookerAs the disclaimer on the second page states this book attempts to salvage a bit of history. It is unfortunate that such a poor scanning of the original 1903 document was the result. This looks like a bad 5th generation photocopy made on a 40 year old Xerox copier. Text is readable, many of the diagrams are not. It reads like there are paragraphs or pages missing (see disclaimer). If one expected to make a clock of this type using this book it is not very useful. It does have some interesting discussion about why certain features were designed the way they were. Unfortunately many of the diagrams referred to are not readable. The book: *Tower Clock: Designed and made for the University of Chicago by the Chicago Manual Training School of the University of Chicago* Covers much of the same material. It also has most of the same diagrams some of which are much easier to read.

This vintage book contains complete directions for making a chiming tower clock. With simple, clear instructions and complete working drawings, this volume will be of utility to those with an interest in making clocks and timepieces. "The Tower Clock and How to Make it" is ideal for those with little previous experience and would make for a valuable addition to collections of allied literature.
