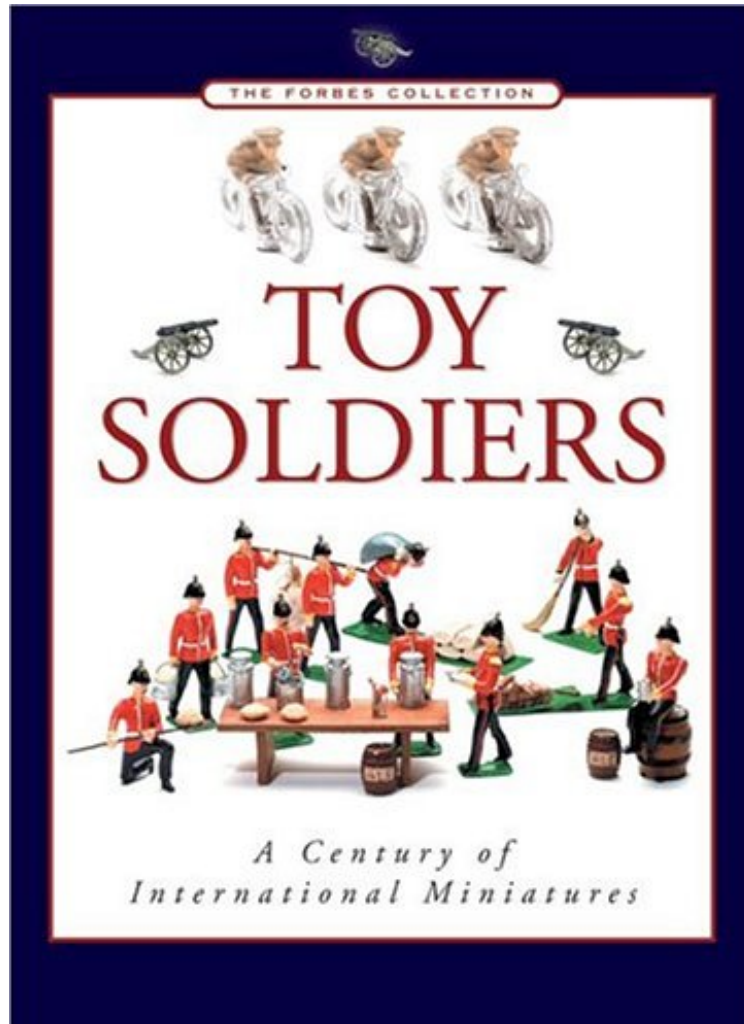

It has full-color photos of highlights of Malcolm Forbes' vast toy soldier collection. Visually it will show a particular diorama in its totality--for example, "Washington Reviews his Troops" or "The Wild West" or "A Man Called Britain"-- and then highlight a few scenes within that diorama showing the figures in closer detail. There are many different dioramas representing different moments in history and different types of soldiers (ie. Aztecs, cowboys, British Grenadiers--hollowcasts, flats, dimestore soldiers). If you have a fascination for history and toy soldiers, this book will be enjoyable--though being a

relatively thin volume, you may hunger for even more photos of the collection. The text is an interesting blend of the story of how the collection was assembled; memories of Malcolm Forbes as recalled by his son, Robert; information on both toy soldiers and toy soldier collecting; even the poem "The Land of Counterpane" about a child and his world of toy soldiers by Robert Louis Stevenson. "Toy Soldiers: A Century of International Miniatures" is a pleasant introduction to not only the Forbes Collection, but also to the appreciation and collecting of colorful and historical toy soldiers.
